





8 years of showing a consistent call volume and trend among the four fire companies



Data showing number of first due calls (calls within own fire district), number of mutual aid responses, and total calls responded to.




Avg. FF's per call 2015-2022

(does not include Fire Police, Fire Commissioner or Assistant).**


Fire Co. Hours in Service at Incidents 2015-2022




8 years of data showing total number of hours spent in service at fire calls (left), and total number of man-hours in service at fire calls during past 8 years (below).

Fire Co. Manhours at Incidents 2015-2022




1st Due Fire Calls by Municipality - 2015-2022




8 years of data showing number of fire calls per municipality – consistent trend

Pct. of Total Fire Calls per Municipality 2015-2022




Two charts showing percentage of fire calls in three municipalities in 2022 and during the past 8 years – closely matching percentages between the two charts.


Total Pct. of Fire Calls by Municipality in 2022





1st Due Fire Calls in Warwick Township in 2022




First Due Calls in Elizabeth Twp. in 2022



Charts showing the data from the past 8 years of the two types of “critical” incidents that the fire companies respond to.




2015-2022 Fire Incidents Time of Day


Pct. of Fire Calls to Daily Shift 2015-2022



Total number of responses to specific incident types in 2022 for the four fire companies.




Fire apparatus responses in 2022, showing first due and mutual aid responses. (X) is total number of responses. Info that needs to be considered when replacing apparatus in the future.

Number of volunteer firefighters who responded to at least 15% of the calls in 2022. This chart does not include fire police officers or any of the paid employees.







Total number of ambulance calls in the WESC region in 2022, and percentage of responses of the overall call volume.




Warwick Ambulance Class Response in 2022





Class 1 Response – Paramedic-required, emergency response;

Class 3 – Non-Emergency response


Warwick Ambulance Call Location in 2022
